A LITANY OF GODSPEED AND FAREWELL FOR A DEPARTING PASTOR

A representative of the Council addresses the departing pastor:

Today, Pastor Ross Goodman is retiring. Therefore, it is time to mark the ending of his ministry here at Saint Paul, a time to look back, and a time to look forward; a time for joy, and a time for sadness. It is a time to give thanks and praise to God for what Ross has given us in our life together.

On August 4, 1996 we called you to be our pastor; to proclaim God's word, to baptize new members into the church of Jesus Christ, to announce God's forgiveness to us, and to preside at our celebrations of the Lord's supper. With the gospel, you challenged us to follow Christ into the world. With the gospel you have comforted us in times of sickness and trouble, and at the death of our loved ones. Sharing our joys and sorrows, you have been important to our life together in the church of Jesus Christ and in our service to this community, and we thank you for your ministry among us.

The pastor replies:

It has been a privilege and blessing to be called as your pastor. I thank each of you and all of you for welcoming me into your lives and for the ways in which we have loved and served together. It has been a blessing to have spent these years with you.

After prayerful discernment it is time for me to retire.

Congregational leader continues.

Do you, the people of Saint Paul, with thanks to God for the ministry of Pastor Ross Goodman among you, now release him from service as your pastor?

Congregation: We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

Pastor Ross, with thanks to God for the members of this community and for their ministry with you, do you recognize and accept the completion of your ministry with Saint Paul?

Pastor: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

I thank you, the people of Saint Paul, for the love and support you have shown me while I ministered among you. I am grateful for the ministry we have shared, and I ask your forgiveness for the mistakes that I have made. I carry with me all I have learned in this place.

Congregation: We receive your thankfulness and we forgive you. We express our gratitude for your time among us. We ask your forgiveness for our mistakes. Your influence on our faith and faithfulness will not leave with your departure.

Pastor: I accept your gratitude and forgiveness, and I forgive you, trusting that our time together and our parting are held in God's mercy and love.

Symbols of a Call to Word and Sacrament Ministry may be returned

People of God, through your call, Pastor Ross has shared the responsibilities of ordained ministry in your midst. When he was installed, you presented him with symbols expressing that role among you. It is time for him to relinquish these symbols.

Pastor returns the Baptismal shell to a member of the congregation.

Congregation member: You were called here to baptize, teach, and to forgive sins.

Pastor: I now relinquish the sign of this office.

Congregation: There is one Body and one Spirit, there is one hope in God's call to us. For your ministry among us we say: "Thanks be to God!"

Pastor returns the Bible to a member of the congregation.

Congregation Member: You were called to proclaim the good news.

Pastor: I now relinquish the sign of this office.

Congregation: The Word of the Lord is our sustaining strength. For your ministry among us we say: "Thanks be to God!"

Pastor will take the Chalice and return it to a member of the congregation.

Congregation Member: You were called to lead worship and preside at the Holy Communion.

Pastor: I now relinquish the sign of this office.

Congregation: Taste and see that the Lord is good; happy are they who trust in God. For your ministry with us we say: "Thanks be to God!"

In holy baptism our Lord Jesus Christ received you, and made you a member of God's church. You were welcomed to Saint Paul and the mission we share as the people of God in this place. Here you have come to know and to share in God's loving purpose for you and for all creation. God has blessed you in this community, and God has blessed this community through you. May you continue to be a blessing to others.

Service continues with congregation blessing and laying on of hands

On this day, Ross, in this place where you have poured yourself out, where you have been emptied and filled and emptied again, may you be aware more than ever of what your heart has opened to here, what it has tended and welcomed here, where it has broken in love and in grief, where it has given and received blessing in the unfathomable mystery that moves us, undoes us, and remakes us finally for joy.

This day may you know this joy in full measure. This day may you know this blessing that gathers you in and sends you forth but will not forget you.

O hear us as this day we say grace; this day we say grateful; this day we say blessing; this day we release you in God's keeping and hold you in gladness and love. Amen.
