2 Thessalonians 2:1-5, 13-17

As to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to him, we beg you, brothers and sisters, not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as though from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord is already here. Let no one deceive you in any way, for that day will not come unless the rebellion comes first and the lawless one is revealed, the one destined for destruction. He opposes and exalts himself above every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, declaring himself to be God. Do you not remember that I told you these things when I was still with you?



SOCIAL MINISTRY UPDATE

Response to current urgent needs: In response to the uncertainty created by the government shutdown resulting in Federal employees working without pay, and the uncertainty of the continuation of the SNAP program, the Social Ministry committee allocated funds to several food pantries in our local neighborhoods. Arlington Eats (arlingtoneats.org), FoodLink (foodlinkma.org) and the Bunker Hill Community College DISH food pantry (bhcc.edu) will receive immediate funds this week. If individuals at St. Paul find themselves in urgent need, please reach out to the Pastoral staff for assistance.

Response to feedback from the Transition Process: To facilitate awareness of a variety of volunteer/donation opportunities, Social Ministry Committee (SMC) will spotlight one organization per month that can host volunteers and also requests donations. SOCIAL MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT FOR NOVEMBER

ARLINGTON EATS. 117 Broadway, Arlington MA. arlington eats

Arlington EATS provides food and personal care items to individuals in need, living in Arlington. If you need assistance, you can find more information on the above website. Saint Paul Lutheran Church is one of only a few churches who collect donations weekly delivering them on Tuesday from 1-6pm. If you place a donation in the basket by the flower order calendar as you enter the church, your donation will be delivered the following Tuesday. Arlington Eats also sends a specific request to churches that donate regularly and you can find each month's request in the bulletin or the weekly newsletter. Given the gap in SNAP funding due to the government shutdown and also with the furlough of federal workers, the need will greatly increase in November. If you have been donating regularly, please consider increasing your donation this month. If you haven't donated before, anything helps. Some helpful guidelines are (counterintuitively) small version are most helpful. Most recipients do not have cars and carry their weekly food items home so the smaller versions of dish soap, vegetable oil, etc. are most appreciated. Many recipients have children at home and so kid friendly meals are helpful too.

VOLUNTEER: Arlington Eats Hosts 120 Volunteer shifts per week. As an individual volunteer in the market, individuals over age 16 are welcome to volunteer. This group has direct contact with recipients. Other volunteer slots include ages 13-15 who can help pack bags for home delivery. To sign up to volunteer, you fill out their online volunteer form. We can also do a group volunteer slot so let any member of SMC know you would be interested in a group event. There is also a teen volunteer slot on Thursday 9-12 if you homeschool or can volunteer during a school holiday. These volunteers pack bags of groceries for delivery to home-bound recipients. For our regular Saint Paul weekly donors who bring bags with handles every week, this is how your bags are used!

HISTORY WITH ST. PAUL: For at least 28 years, Saint Paul has collected weekly donations and delivered them to Arlington's Food Pantry. Originally this food pantry was run out of the basement of the tiny Church of our Savior Episcopal church down a steep set of stairs and recipients would form a long line around the block when receiving assistance. In 2012-2014 a grass-roots community effort was started to bring attention to hunger in the town of Arlington. A group including Christine Bongiorno, now Arlington's Deputy Town Manager, Wendy Stack, a member of Saint Paul, and leadership from Calvary United Methodist Church and the historic Pleasant Street Congregational church (congregation has since disbanded) along with a cohort of concerned Arlington residents, began a series of meetings to address this generally. From this effort multiple 501(c)3 non-profits were started with key leadership from this grassroots team. One group prepared bag lunches for school vacations and the summer holiday for children in need. The majority of these students attended the Thompson Elementary School. Another group formed a formal 501(c)3 for the existing food pantry as the founders were getting older and wanted to ensure continuity of the program. Ultimately these efforts were rolled into a single organization now known as Arlington Eats. Simultaneously, efforts through the Arlington Housing Commission and the Arlington Housing Corporation (also a 501(c)3 non-profit organization founded in 1990 to address affordable housing) worked together to purchase the land at 117 Broadway, formerly a Friendly's restaurant). For this purchase, Saint Paul committed \$3,000 per year for three years. The Pleasant Street Congregational church committed their entire

endowment (\$12,000 per year for 3 years). The town indicated that without these two commitments, they would not have made the purchase. This funding covered the purchase and holding of the property while grants could be written. Fundraising was carried out, a grant was written for construction and every time you drive by 117 Broadway, you can feel proud that Saint Paul was instrumental, both in volunteer hours as well as a financial commitment for the presence of these 6 affordable housing units as well as the entire retail space occupied by Arlington EATS. From an inaccessible church basement, the former food pantry has evolved into the Arling EATS Market, a space where recipients can shop without stigma entirely supported by a busy group of volunteers. Through the combination of appointments and walk-in hours, there are no longer lines down the street to receive food assistance.

And the connections don't stop there! Magnolia Community Garden, a recreational program hosted by the Town of Arlington (sign up on the Town Rec site) features 50 plots where Arlington residents can grow veggies. This group has been given a large expanse of the park to grow fresh veggies for Arlington EATS and they made approximately 20 deliveries of tomatoes and other produce from July through September. And finally, our own Lisa Chiulli Lay leads a non-profit, (Lamplight Women's Literacy Center) that provides English Language and Health Career Pathways classes for New Americans that meet in the Arlington EATS space.

We hope you will consider volunteering at Arlington EATS or donating (see their website for donations). At this time they can provide the most food through cash donations as they can shop wholesale to supply the market.
