About Today's Cover Art The Rev. Cara B. Hochhalter is a United Church of Christ (UCC) minister. She received her Masters of Divinity from United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities in Minnesota, where she studied the intersections of art, theology and justice.

The images in her book, *A Challenging Peace in the Life and Stories of Jesus* were created through the simple print-making process of carving out a block, applying ink and pulling a print. Cara says, "The interaction of light and dark is important in each image as we cannot have one without the other. The dark defines the light, and vice versa. I find this to be theological as we look to the whole—the light and the dark, the joy and the despair, the peace and the conflict—all under an umbrella of Divine Love that yearns for wholeness."



A reading from Second Peter.

We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying,

"This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.





Lent begins with a solemn call to prayer, fasting and repentance as we begin the journey through ashes to Easter. The spare, powerful liturgy of Ash Wednesday begins at 7:00PM. Make space in your life to receive both a sign of your mortality and a foretaste of the feast to come.

HOLDEN EVENING PRAYER AND SOUP SUPPERS | Wednesdays in Lent

Beginning on February 25, we gather for midweek Lenten prayer on five successive Wednesdays. At 6PM, we share a simple meal of soup and conversation. At 7PM, we sing Holden Evening Prayer in the sanctuary.

During these services, we will consider portions of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount and comments on the Sermon by Dietrich Bonhoeffer in his book Discipleship.

Lamplight students come from over 19 different countries and work primarily in childcare, cleaning, construction, patient care, and delivery job sectors. All programs are offered free of charge.

How we help:

- English as a Second Language (ESOL) program offering three levels of English instruction, four evenings a week, at Arlington Housing Authority and Arlington EATS
- Healthcare Careers Pathways program preparing CNAs and entry level healthcare workers for success on the TEAS nursing school entrance exam in English and math
- Individualized resume writing, interview prep, job search support, and college advising
- Community resource connections
