PROCESSIONAL GOSPEL **Matthew 21:1-11**

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, “Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, ‘The Lord needs them.’ And he will send them immediately.” This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet:

“Tell the daughter of Zion,
Look, your king is coming to you,
humble and mounted on a donkey,
and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.”

The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting,

“Hosanna to the Son of David!
Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!
Hosanna in the highest heaven!”

When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, “Who is this?” The crowds were saying, “This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee.”

BLESSING OF PALMS


The members of the congregation raise their branches.

The St. Paul Council met and deliberated for two and a half hours, discussing approximately 30 people. The synod and church constitution require that this is a six-person committee. One person is a council member, per guidance. The council referenced a list of considerations when assembling the committee. You can find it on page 12 of the [Pastoral Transition Document](#).

This committee was prayerfully and thoughtfully assembled. Please feel free to reach out to the committee if there is a candidate you would particularly like us to consider. We can pass along these names to the synod who will ask them to note interest in their Rostered Minister Profile. The call committee will also be assembling a list of questions to ask candidates. If you would like to send committee members particular questions to consider, please reach out to them.

The committee must work confidentially in order to protect the candidate and the process. The committee chair will give the congregation an update every three weeks.
